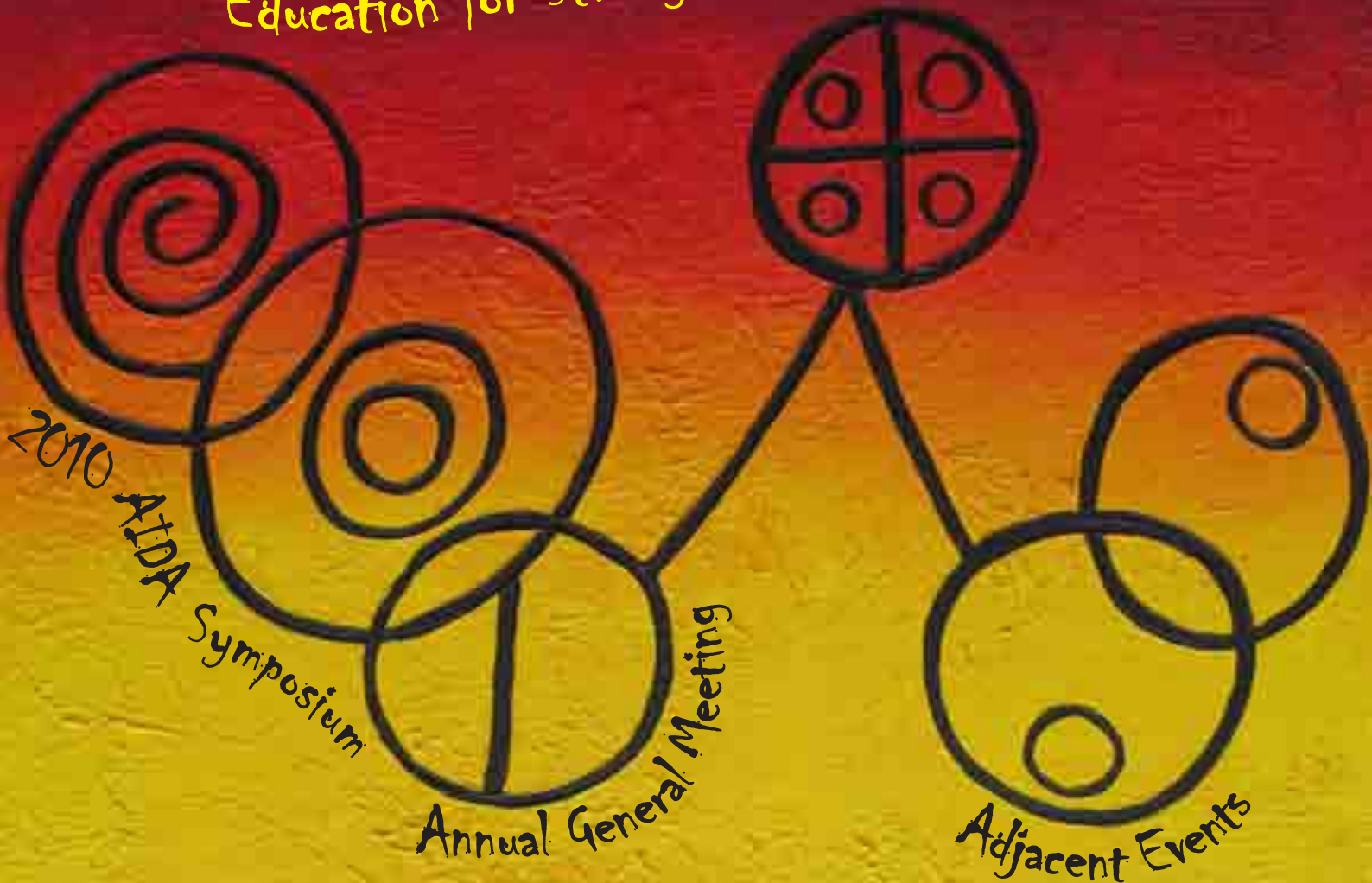

Symposium Logo and Story



This logo tells the story of solidarity and education in connection with the Tasmanian Aboriginal Petroglyphs [Rock carvings].

The petroglyphs were used to educate the youths within the Aboriginal tribes in Tasmania. The rock carvings also depict the presence of the Tasmanian Aboriginal people within a tactile landscape.

The joining of individual petroglyphs depicts the coming together at meeting places.

The bright colours reveal the health and beauty of getting out into the natural environment of a Tasmanian sunset.
